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Riding on Excellence on all Fronts

Institutions of higher learning contribute immensely to the personal and professional lives of students and enrich the intellectual, economic, and cultural fabric of their communities and nations. Perhaps the most acknowledged roles of these institutions are to prepare quality manpower to assist in national development and to foster a culture of life-long learning in the society. For these and other reasons, these institutions are expected to put a great deal of emphasis on the quality of their academic programmes, invest heavily in their academic infrastructure, and engage a team of highly qualified and motivated staff.

Unfortunately, past studies reveal a worrying global trend where majority of higher education institutions are now primarily concentrating on raising student enrollment and retention without increasing the academic quality and staff capabilities. This only results in poor caliber graduates who in most cases are unemployable.

It is not a bad idea to focus on numbers but institutions need to adopt a more balanced approach. This means adopting aggressive enrollment tactics to foster institutional growth and some level of

initiatives aimed at raising the academic standards. Unlike other institutions of higher learning in the region, Oshwal College has for the past 23 years focused on building a reputation of delivering high quality training in accounting, finance, business management, information technology as well as in the areas of procurement and supply. In all these programmes, the college has consistently produced top performing students in Kenya and also in the world. ***For instance, in the 2013/2014 exam sessions, a total of eleven students undertaking the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) qualification were ranked position one in Kenya in various papers and also managed to attain top 20 positions in the ACCA global rankings.*** In the Association of Business Executives exams, 2 students emerged top both in Kenya and in the world. The College also recorded impressive performances in the degree programmes offered in collaboration with the University of Greenwich-UK. ***In BSc (Hons)-Computing and Bachelor of Arts (Hons) Business Studies degree programmes, a total of 14 students graduated with first class honours.*** In all degree awarding institutions, a first class honours degree is awarded only to students who show extraordinary depth of

understanding, creativity and achievement in undergraduate studies.

Such a level of achievement cannot go unnoticed. Consequently, in 2012, the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) of UK awarded Platinum status in tuition provision to Oshwal College. ***Platinum is the highest and the most prestigious attainable status under ACCA's Approved Learning Partner - Student Tuition programme.*** In Africa, there are 11 Platinum Status tuition providers and only 3 in Kenya; Oshwal College being one of the three.

As a result of providing quality education consistent with the requirements of major examining and awarding bodies, ***Oshwal College was early this year identified as an able partner in tuition provision for the Associate Chartered Accountant (ACA) qualification administered by The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW).*** Through this accreditation, the College now becomes one of the two institutions in Kenya authorized to offer the 3 advanced stage papers designed for ICPAK members desiring to convert into ICAEW Chartered Accountants.

Apart from student focus, the college also has a rich history of attracting and retaining high-calibre staff in both academic and administrative areas. Therefore, the students are mentored by a team of highly qualified and dedicated staff whose focus is students' success both in class and in extra-curricular activities. Over the years, academic staff members have won accolades for mentoring top students in Kenya and in the world. In spite

of winning these awards, they all seem to have no intention of resting on their laurels going by their current performance and zeal. The college also puts a lot of emphasis on industrial attachment, corporate visits, seminars and conferences all aimed at exposing students and staff to the real world of work and acquainting them with the latest developments in the industry. Apart from helping our students become industry-ready for work assignments, these corporate interface initiatives help our teaching staff to keep teaching and learning in the College relevant to the job market. Our major corporate partners who give our students and staff an opportunity to tour and also do their industrial attachments include leading banks, accounting and audit firms, ICT companies and well established manufacturing companies.

Last but not least, Oshwal college students are always very active in extra-curricular activities. They normally participate in a number of activities ranging from community outreach, games, sports, clubs, student leadership and artistic activities. These activities are highly recommended and encouraged by the College as they complement the curriculum and also augment the student's educational experience. In a bid to encourage more participation in these activities, Oshwal College has a fully-fledged sports department which is headed by a professional sports instructor who mentors the students in different extra-curricular activities. In addition, the college organises sports giving days to honour and celebrate outstanding sports personalities in college. The prize giving days are highly regarded and are normally presided over by renowned sports personalities.

ACCA Global Learning Providers' Conference 2015 - London, UK

On 11th-12th February 2015, the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) convened their biennial Global Learning Providers' Conference at The Thistle Marble Arch Hotel, London, United Kingdom, and Oshwal College was represented by the Acting Principal, Mrs. Jayashree Prathap. The aim of the conference was to give an opportunity to all ACCA's approved learning partners from around the world to come together, network and gain practical insight into ACCA's examinations. The event also allows the learning partners to engage with education providers from many of the 180 markets within which CCA operates, as well as members of the ACCA examining team and ACCA staff.

The tuition providers also had an opportunity to meet with representatives from other ACCA key partners including BPP Learning Media, Kaplan Publishing, Becker Professional Education, Oxford Brookes University, University of London and Educate.

The conference's plenary sessions focused the attention of the participants on ACCA strategy towards 2020 and how they plan to work with education partners to achieve it, as well as the developments in ACCA Qualification. There were also examiner and specialist workshops during the two day event. The examiner workshops gave the participants an opportunity to hear directly from ACCA's examiners and understand about their approach to the exams. The specialist workshops on the other hand, focused on building employability skills in students, the relevance and rigor assured in the ACCA qualification and how ACCA can work with the participants, particularly the learning providers, in growing the ACCA market and how ACCA and its partners can support the learning providers in developing their business.

The knowledge gained from this event will go a long way in helping the College in its planning and development of the ACCA programme.

CFA and CIPS open day

On 20th January 2015, Oshwal College held an open day for current and prospective CFA and CIPS students. The event was designed to enable prospective students to learn more about the CFA and CIPS programmes as well as assist them in planning for their next steps to a career in finance, investment, procurement and supply.

Hell's Gate

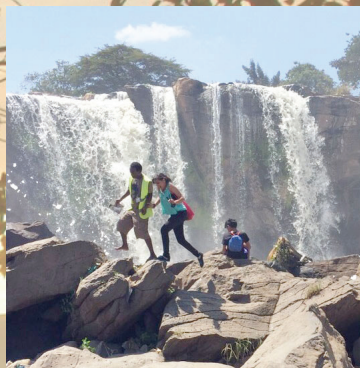

Higher National Diploma in Computing & Systems Development

This is a two year programme offered at Oshwal College and is considered to be a flagship vocational qualification awarded by Pearson Education, UK. The programme allows students to develop a wide range of technical skills in software development, programming, networking, web technologies and other systems development capabilities required in the current information technology industry. Apart from equipping students with these cutting-edge skills, the course inculcates in students a set of personal qualities and traits needed for successful performance at work thereby enabling them to make valuable contribution at their workplaces.

On successful completion of the HND programme, students have the option to top up the diploma qualification to a full Bachelor's degree by joining the final year of study at leading universities or directly enter employment. Students wishing to study in UK can enroll at the final year of an Honours degree course at University of Greenwich, Middlesex University, London Metropolitan University, Anglia Ruskin University, Hertfordshire University and University College London among others. The course opens up good career prospects in IT and related industries, where a student can gain employment in such roles as a software engineer/developer, IT specialist, IT support, database designer or administrator, systems administrator, web designer and systems analyst among others.

At Oshwal College, majority of the students who successfully complete the BTEC HND Diploma in Computing and Systems Development opt to progress onto the final year of the BSc (Hons)-Computing degree offered by Oshwal College in collaboration with the University of Greenwich-UK.

To complete this qualification, students at Oshwal College must take the following units:

1. Design a Small or Home Office (SOHO) Network

1. Programming in Java
2. Project Design, Implementation and Evaluation
3. Information Systems in Organisations
4. Digital Image Creation and Development

Semester Two

1. Business Skills for e-Commerce
2. IT Support for End Users
3. Internet Server Management
4. Project Design Implementation and Evaluation

Assessment is done through a variety of coursework assignments including case studies, problem solving, practical assessments, and computer-based tests. Teaching methods include lectures, practical sessions, group work, tutorials and workshops. In addition, substantial learning resources and support materials are available in the library and online to support both college-based and home-based learning.

The IT industry is rapidly expanding with new specializations emerging every day. Therefore, those pursuing the BTEC HND-Computing and Systems Development will continue to be in demand in different sectors of the economy.



New Courses 2015

- **ACA qualification from ICAEW** (The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales)

ICPAK members will now be able to study for the ACA qualification from ICAEW at Oshwal College. To complete this prestigious finance and business qualification, the members will be required to study for 3 ICAEW advanced stage papers which include Corporate Reporting, Strategic Business Management and Case Study. The programme will be delivered by a team of well selected business, accounting and finance professionals.

- **CIPS Advanced Certificate in Procurement and Supply Operations**

In the procurement and supply chain field, Oshwal College is now offering Advanced Certificate in Procurement and Supply Operations. This course is awarded by the Chartered Institute of Procurement & Supply (CIPS - UK) and is designed to cover the fundamental procurement and supply concepts, giving learners with little or no experience the skills to develop their career in procurement and supply chain.

- **CFA Level 2 program**

Students who have successfully completed their CFA Level 1 qualification will be able to study for the CFA Level 2 program at Oshwal College. The level 2 program aims at equipping the learners with skills required for undertaking complex analysis, asset valuation and application of standards, tools and concepts learnt in CFA Level 1 program curriculum.

CORPORATE PARTNERS AWARDS & RECOGNITION

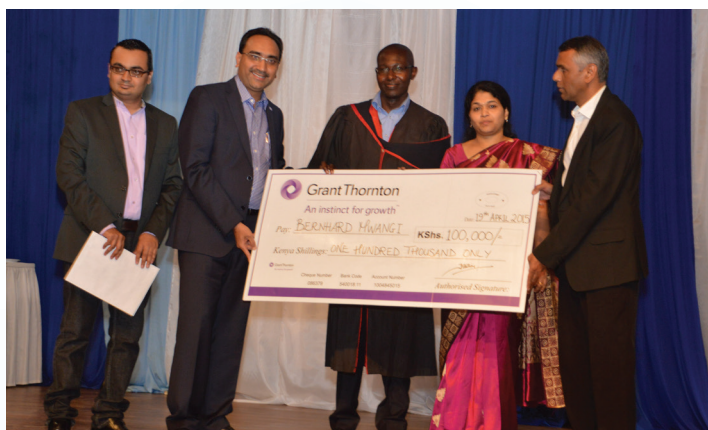
