Driven by his passion for technology and the desire to make the life of medical personnel easy, Akash ventured into the design and development of an Artificial Intelligent robot to assist doctors in their day-to-day routine activities. This unique project marked the culmination of his study for the BSc (Hons) Computing Degree that is offered by Oshwal College in collaboration with the University of Greenwich in the United Kingdom (UK). The robot will, among other tasks, assist medics in carrying out routine tasks such as delivering light packages like medication, snacks, prescriptions and messages. By doing so, it will minimise in-person contact between medical personnel and sick patients and therefore, act as a tool for reducing the exposure to transmissible diseases like Covid-19, influenza and other similar diseases.

Over the years, our BSc (Hons) Computing students have produced exceptionally high-quality final year projects which have been recognised by the University of Greenwich as potential game-changers for the IT industry.

Akash has also been active in sports, club activities, charity events, leadership and music. He played for the Kenyan national under-19 cricket team on multiple occasions, of which one series was played against the Zimbabwe national under-19 team in 2017 at Kwekwe Sports Club in Zimbabwe. He also served as the President of Oshwal College Students Association (OCSA). In music, he is a good guitar player who normally plays for leisure and is aiming at perfecting his skills in this through regular practice.
